It's that time of year again where we start planning for next year. Based on what we know so far, St. Joseph's is looking to hire for the following teaching positions:

1.0 FTE Elementary teacher. Specific grade level dependent on the candidate and internal staffing re-arrangements.

0.4 FTE French (teach French to all grades)

0.5 FTE primary teacher (focus on UFLI/reading and Math) skill in UFLI instruction an asset

We also anticipate the need to hire two full time support staff.

It is with deep sadness that I share the news of the passing of His Holiness, Pope Francis.

As the spiritual leader of the Roman Catholic Church, Pope Francis was an amazing and humble leader. His tireless work for peace, justice, and care for all people – especially the poor and vulnerable – touched hearts around the world and inspired millions to live the Gospel with courage and love. He reminded us through both his words and actions that Christ's love is for everyone.
